



# Homework Policy

## PURPOSE

To outline to our school community the Department's and Epping Views Primary School's policy requirements relating to homework.

## SCOPE

This policy applies to students in all year levels and staff responsible for setting and monitoring homework at Epping Views Primary School.

## RATIONALE

Epping Views Primary School has developed this Homework Policy in consultation with the School Improvement Team and the School Council to support student and wellbeing by:

- Encouraging students to enrich or extend knowledge individually and imaginatively
- Support learning partnerships with parents/carers
- Fostering good lifelong learning and study habits
- Providing opportunities for students to apply new knowledge and prepare for future lesson

This Homework Policy has been intentionally designed to support students throughout their learning journey, focusing on an introduction to independent exploration and learning in the early years, building independent learning skills in the middle years, and preparing for high school readiness in the upper years.

## DEFINITIONS

**Homework** is tasks assigned to students by teachers that are meant to be carried out during non-school hours.

## POLICY

At Epping Views Primary School all homework set by teachers will be:

- Designed to help students develop as independent learners
- Appropriate to student's skill level and age. As the student progresses they will extend time spent on each task to build stamina.
- Designed to recognise student's own contributions to their home/community outside of school

The following outlines the types of homework that students can complete outside of school hours. Reading and digital learning tasks will be monitored weekly by teachers. Families can determine how many minutes their child/ren complete homework across the week based on their own family commitments.

### Prep, 1

- Math Seeds
- Reading for pleasure and take home books
- Reading Eggs
- Magic and Gemstone Words Reading (spelling of words once advised by the teacher)

### Year 2, 3, 4

- Mathletics
- Reading for pleasure and take home books
- Reading Eggs
- Magic and Gemstone Words Reading and Spelling (home program)

### Year - 5, 6

- Mathletics
- Reading for pleasure
- Reading Eggs/Eggspress
- Student led digital learning options - Behind The News. Khan Academy, Kidz News

## SHARED EXPECTATIONS AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Homework is a shared responsibility between the school, teachers, students and their parents/carers. In order to get the most out of homework tasks, it is important that everyone understands their responsibilities.

Responsibilities and expectations for **leaders**:

- Advise teachers, students and parents/carers of homework expectations at the beginning of the school year and provide them with access to the homework policy.

Responsibilities and expectations for teachers:

- Set homework tasks that are appropriate to students' skill level and age
- Ensure the amount of homework set supports a student to engage with a range of recreational, family and cultural activities outside school hours

Responsibilities and expectations for students are:

- Being aware of homework policy
- Discussing homework expectations with parents/carers
- Accepting responsibility for completion of homework tasks within set time frames
- Organising their time to manage homework obligations, participation in physical activity and sports, recreational and cultural activities (for the Upper Years)

Responsibilities and expectations for parents/carers are:

- Ensuring there is a balance between time spent on homework and recreational, family and cultural activities
- Discussing homework with their children in their first language, if English is not the main language spoken at home

## SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS AND PARENTS

Epping Views Primary School understands that students have different learning strengths, preferences and interests and may approach learning activities and homework differently. If parents/carers are concerned their child may not understand the homework tasks that have been set, is spending a lot of time completing their homework or needs adjustments, we encourage them to speak to their child's teacher.
